Our Summer Challenge is designed to ensure students' engagement in learning during the summer. This summer, your student can use Classworks to support summer learning. The instruction they'll work on is based on their individual needs.

What is Classworks?

Classworks is a resource that gives your students individualized instruction to support them in reading and math. First, let's briefly review how you can help your child when using Classworks.

Getting Started:

Find a quiet place for them to work on the computer independently. It's important that all of the work done in Classworks, including the games and quizzes, are done by the student on their own.

How to Log In:

There are three easy steps to get your student working in Classworks.

STEP 1: Your student will access Classworks through Launchpad by visiting: students.dekalbschoolsga.org.



STEP 2: Once your student has logged into Launchpad, your student will locate the Classworks app.



STEP 3: Sign in with Microsoft.

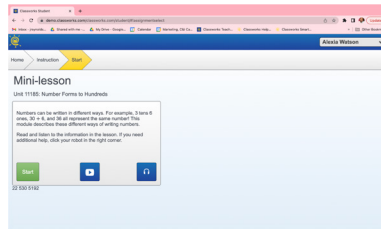
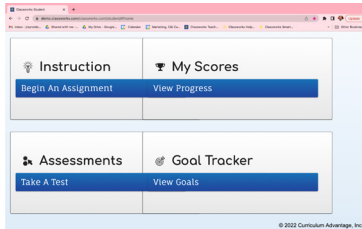

Instructional Activities

We recommend students spend around 1 hour a week in Classworks per subject (ELA and Math) completing the learning activities.

They should select the blue button in the instruction box to begin working on the games and activities. Each instructional unit starts with a Classworks Mini-lesson, and they are the “teacher” of that lesson.

These are all read aloud fluently; your student can click on the robot head for more support.



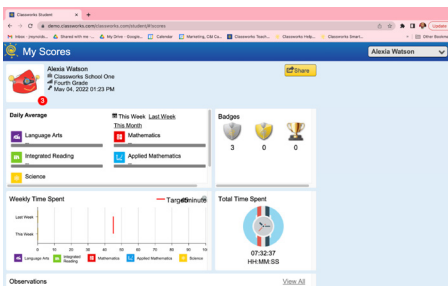
Helping Your Student Along the Way

Checking Progress

You'll want to check their progress. Sit down with your student and look at their My Scores page. Take this opportunity to look at how much time they spent in Classworks, the badges and shields they have earned, and their mastery in each subject. Click a subject to see what skills your child is learning. Click on the unit name to practice the skill together. What great insight into your child's learning!



Students will receive credit for the summer challenge if a minimum of (8) hours of time on task (TOT) per subject (math and ELA) is accumulated in Classworks. Your student will have access to work on these lessons from May 24th - July 31st.
